From Our Priest-In-Charge

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Living In the Spirit

On this Feast of Pentecost, I am reflecting on the various fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23). Sometimes these qualities are virtues that, with God's help, we exercise intentionally in order to cultivate, and sometimes these qualities are gifts that seem to emanate naturally from deep within. Either way, when we act in accord with and out of these fruits we know the divine life more intimately and grow more deeply in the love of the triune God.

On April 18 our Diocesan Consultant, Helen Daley, led a wonderful parish discussion about what we value and what our hopes are for All Saints'. While our parish seems to be developing in wonderful and energizing, Spirit-filled ways, we are aware that All Saints' has financial and other challenges (in their reports in this newsletter, our Wardens and Treasurer go into more specifics). At our meeting I was encouraged by the parish's openness and willingness to be flexible and faithful. Thank you.

We have begun to pray for our community during our weekly Prayers of the People that we be open to who God is calling us to be and to serve. My prayer for this All Saints' parish community is that we be open – *Ephphatha* – and responsive to the Spirit's movements in our shared life that we may deeply know and show forth, in all that we undertake, the many fruits of God's Holy Spirit.

God wants so much for us! While our future is somewhat fuzzy, we know that the Holy Spirit has been and continues to be present in our community. Jesus promises us that when the Spirit comes, the Spirit will guide us into all truth (John 16). So wherever God may lead us, wherever our journey takes us, the Holy Spirit is our companion on the way!

Wardens' Report

While time has passed since our last report, work continues to be done. We are finalizing our 2014 Creation Care Grant with new frames being placed on the last 4 lower windows and a few other minor repairs.

Our application for the 2015 Creation Care Grant was accepted and we have been awarded a total of \$10,000 less the work that Mass Save will complete. We are waiting for the final report from Mass Save before we begin work this year. We are planning to move the thermostat from the main vestibule to the inside wall at the back of the church. This will help to control the heat at the back of the church. We will also be installing additional interior storm windows on the stained glass windows in the Sanctuary, main vestibule and Undercroft. The lamps and ballast on all interior lights will be replaced. Work is also planned for the Sanctuary fans, which have not been functioning for a while. We hope that this will help to more evenly distribute heat during the winter. We will keep you updated on when these improvements will occur.

Our meeting with Helen Daley was extremely helpful to the Vestry as we continue to look for ways to repurpose our building and increase our income. The Vestry met with Kurt Franklin at our May Vestry meeting to discuss options. While we search and look for the best options available to us, we are grateful to everyone for their continued support and encouragement. Yvonne Dwoske was amazing in the way she tackled all of her "treasures" in the Attic for our Spring Fair! Thank you, Yvonne!

As much as we would prefer not to discuss change, your Vestry knows that without change the place we know and love, as "All Saints'" cannot continue to exist without additional funding. We appreciate your help and look forward to hearing your ideas. Please pray for guidance as we move forward.

Treasurer's Message

During our parish discussion back on April 18, we talked about what was important to us, who we were as a church, who we are now, and who we want to become. We shared what we value and our dreams for All Saints'. We celebrated changes and challenges we've faced over recent years, recognized that we are survivors, and true people of faith. We thoughtfully considered our future as All Saints' parish, how we can continue to meet the challenges that come our way and continue to exist as a parish for many years to come. I believe this time we spent together is our first step, arm in arm, into an exciting future for our beloved All Saints' community.

It's always hard to talk about money and a conversation about money was an important part of the parish discussion. We talked about our income and our expenses. We brainstormed ways to increase income, decrease expense, and many good suggestions were made.

As Treasurer, I need to say to you that one of our biggest challenges in the near future is going to be financial. To continue as All Saints' parish, it is critical we find additional funding and we must begin to address this need now, well before we are in danger of closing our doors, because this is not going to be a quick fix issue. Our Vestry has already started this important work, investigating how we might use space in our building to increase revenues.

In June you will be receiving in the mail more detailed information on our financial status, what we've learned about repurposing space in our building, and other options that may have come to light that could be viable ways of increasing income.

Please speak with me or anyone on the Vestry about your ideas and concerns as we enter this new chapter in our church's life. And please pray that we will be accepting and open to God's will for us as we plan for our future.

February 16, 2015**

The meeting began at 7:00 with opening prayer led by Rev. Meghan.

Minutes: Lyn moved to accept the amended minutes of the January 19, 2015 meeting. Judy 2nd and the motion carried. Cindy abstained.

Financial Reports:

- Evelyn distributed and reviewed the January Treasurer's Report and the P & L. Martha moved to accept the Treasurer's reports as presented. Marian 2nd and the motion carried.
- Evelyn was not able to provide a copy of the One Family Treasurer's Report due to technical issues. She did report the current account balance. The paper report will be coming.

Building and Facilities:

- Lyn reported that two weeks ago she and Rev. Meghan toured the building with Jeff Brown, the architect recommended by the Diocese. He talked about gas, electricity, and other things that we have already assessed, and at the time did not offer concrete ideas on what to do with the space. Helen Daley's husband is the facilities manager at Boston University and he is scheduled to do a walk through and Lyn has also reached out to another person in Rhode Island. Rev. Meghan will speak with the Diocese about our non-profit status if we decide to rent space.
- Lyn is working on the 2015 Green Grant proposal. We are looking at fixing or replacing the ceiling fans in the sanctuary, interior storm windows and insulation in the back of the church.
- We have received a letter from Bishop Gates approving the Bishop's Vestry and the extension of Rev. Meghan's contract through June 2017.

- Applications for the One Family Program Manager were due yesterday. Three applications have been received and they will be reviewed by the One Family Board at their meeting tomorrow. The Board will also establish the interview process.
- Eucharistic visitor training has been rescheduled for March 28, 2015.
- Rev. Meghan distributed and reviewed a revision of proposed fees for funerals/memorial services. She requested that any comments be shared with her before the March Vestry meeting so the final proposal can be presented.
- Michael Smith from the Boy Scouts will work with Judy on a Scout project to plant flowers on Patriot's Day. Kevin is asking about other projects that the Boy Scouts can do around the church and one suggestion is to wash the floor in the undercroft.
- Evelyn announced the deadline for the newsletter is February 23, 2015.
- Judy brought up possibly placing an ad for the church in the Relay for Life Book. The fees are \$200.00 for a full page, \$110.00 for a half page and \$65.00 for a quarter page color ad. There was discussion about asking parishioners to contribute and then the church would make up the difference. This will be discussed again.
- Rev. Meghan has reached out to the person who manages our website and is hoping to hear back soon so that we can move forward with updating the site.
- The VPOD schedule was distributed for sign up.

Clergy and Warden's Reports:

- There were no Clergy or Warden reports.

Closing Prayer:

Rev. Meghan closed the meeting with a prayer.

The meeting began at 7:00 with opening prayer led by Rev. Meghan.

Minutes: Evelyn moved to accept the minutes of the February 16, 2015 meeting. Lyn 2nd and the motion carried.

Financial Reports:

- Evelyn distributed and reviewed the February Treasurer's Report and the P & L. Marian moved to accept the Treasurer's reports as presented. Martha 2nd and the motion carried.
- Evelyn presented the One Family Treasurer's Report. Marian moved to accept the report as presented. Rich 2nd and the motion carried.

Updates:

- Three candidates have been interviewed for the One Family Program Manager position. All three are qualified and interested in the position. CORI checks are pending. The start date will be March 28, 2015. The Case Grant application to pay for the Program Manager was approved and \$6,000 has been received.
- Rev. Meghan has received communication from the Diocese that the language in 8.3 (Rector Powers & Duties) of our By-Laws is not in agreement with the National Constitution and Canons. Therefore, we will add language to Rev. Meghan's contract to address the collaboration concerns. Evelyn moved to change the language in 8.3 to reflect the Diocese wording. Judy 2nd and the motion carried. The change will need to go back to the Standing Committee and then will need to be voted on again by the parish.

Vote Affirmations:

- Lyn moved to reaffirm the electronic vote on February 26, 2016 to approve the Parochial Report. Cindy 2nd and the motion carried
- Evelyn moved to reaffirm the vote of approval of the 2015 Green Grant application. Judy 2nd and the motion carried.
- Richard moved to reaffirm the Green Grant Committee members of Rev. Meghan, Lyn, Marian, Evelyn and Martha. Judy 2nd and the motion carried.

Planning:

- Helen Daley led us in a lengthy discussion about the challenges, desires and needs of the parish to remain viable. Helen will return at a later date to lead the parish in a similar conversation,

New and Returning Business:

- Judy reported that the Boy Scouts will be here on Patriots Day to spruce up the grounds and perhaps do some planting. There was discussion about the need to remove the dead tree in the back of the church, as well as a possible fundraiser to cover the expense.
- Judy presented a copy of the proposed ad for the Relay for Life booklet. She will take the comments back to the designers.

Clergy and Warden's Reports:

- Rev. Meghan reported that there are three adult confirmands.
- There was no Warden's report.

Closing Prayer:

Rev. Meghan closed the meeting with a prayer.

Vestry Meeting Minutes
April 20, 2015**

Present: Rev. Meghan Sweeney, Barbara Boynton, Marian Coté, Lyn Darling, Richard DeCusati, Judy Little, Martha Lingard, Evelyn Sanford.

The meeting began at 7:00 with opening prayer led by Rev. Meghan.

Minutes: Barbara moved to accept the minutes of the March 16, 2015 meeting. Evelyn 2nd and the motion carried.

Financial Reports:

- Evelyn distributed and reviewed the March Treasurer's Report and the P & L and the 2015 budget compared to actual for the first quarter. Evelyn noted that the balance on the Stokes loan is \$23,778.05 with four years left to pay it off at \$496.35 per month. There was discussion about paying the loan off early to avoid the finance charges. However in order to do this we would need to take money from the DIT account and this does not make sense at this time. Marian moved to accept the Treasurer's reports as presented. Judy 2nd and the motion carried.
- Evelyn presented the One Family Treasurer's Report. Judy moved to accept the report as presented. Rich 2nd and the motion carried.

New and Returning Business:

- Lyn has spoken with Esther Powell at the Diocese regarding the Green Grant. They agreed to have an energy evaluation done by Mass Save to see if any rebates are available. The final amount will be determined following this evaluation, but it looks promising at this time. Lyn has spoken with Steve Robinson to arrange to have as many windows repaired as possible with the remaining \$1200.00 from the 2014 Green Grant. Additionally he will repair the gutters at our expense.
- Rev. Meghan announced that she will be on vacation for the month of July. Marian will arrange for a supply priest. After discussion it was agreed that services will remain in the Sanctuary this summer. The service will start at 9:30 from June 21, 2015 through Labor Day.
- The Darlings will be hosting the annual parish picnic on June 14, 2015.
- Rev. Meghan distributed a revised funeral fee schedule. Following review and discussion she will update it again and bring it back to the May meeting.
- Bishop Harris is not able to be here on our 125th anniversary due to a schedule conflict; however she will be here on December 13, 2015. A vestry meeting will follow the service.

- Our 125th anniversary is November 1, 2015. There was discussion about a celebration dinner, advertising, making a program book of memories, etc. Marian will chair a committee to oversee the activities.
- Robin's computer was purchased in 2008, is very slow and is making unusual noises. Lyn moved to replace the computer, monitor and network connections, not to exceed \$800.00. Barbara 2nd the motion. Marian questioned if a laptop would be more economical, however after discussion it was agreed that due to screen and keyboard size this would not be a good option. The motion passed.
- The Boy Scouts have expressed interest in preparing breakfast for the congregation. Rev. Meghan suggested that a better option would be to have them wait tables at our anniversary dinner. Marian will contact Kevin to discuss this. Today the Boy Scouts came and turned over the gardens and planted marigolds. Additionally they cleaned the floors upstairs.
- Judy distributed the final proof of the ad for the Relay for Life booklet. The relay is on June 12th & 13th. Next month we will discuss the possibility of participating in the event.
- Marykatherine McCutcheon has blessed us with her beautiful voice for the past two weeks to lead the congregation through the hymns. It was agreed that she is a welcome addition and we will continue to have her join us when she is available.
- The new One Family Program Manager, Michelle Pinto-Micelli, lead the last meeting and she is off to a great start. One Family has purchased a tax free B J's membership for her to purchase supplies. An account has been funded to allow her to use a VISA debit card. There was discussion at the meeting regarding using real dishes and using the dishwasher for One Family events. A decision was deferred until after the Mass Save assessment to analyze the cost of running the dishwasher.
- Rev. Meghan led a discussion about the parish meeting held on April 19th and what the next steps should be. It was agreed to provide the parish with detailed financial data.
Additionally Kurt Franklin from Remax will be asked to attend a Vestry meeting to provide more information about leasing space.

Clergy and Warden's Reports:

- There were no Clergy or Warden's reports.

Closing Prayer:

Rev. Meghan closed the meeting with a prayer.

The next Vestry meeting will be May 18, 2015 at 7:00pm.
